





FOR THE GLORY OF INDIA

ndian freedom fighter Bhagat Singh was 23 when the Britishers hanged him for 'plotting against them'. They had offered to let him live if he gave up his rebellion. He told them he preferred being shot!

I learned about Bhagat Singh from my father. My father was a bibliophile, and a collector of books, who enjoyed reading to me, and to early teenagers like me, when we would gather at the portico of our house. Of all the books in his collection, he loved most of all, to read Bhagat Singh's biography. This was Delhi in the 1980s, and books were still a draw for the young.

Deepak Saini, whom I met around that time, was about the same age as Bhagat Singh in 1931, the year the latter was hanged. Deepak was from Punjab and had just moved into a house in our neighborhood. Many mornings, I would spot him waiting for the University bus that took him to his college on the North Campus.

Our housing colony was an old neighborhood. Many of the families had been there since the 1950s and 60s. Naturally, everyone knew everyonesometimes more than was desirable!

I remember when Mr. Gupta's daughter, Nisha, had left home to be with a young man she met at work. It had become the talk of the colony for months. To save themselves the ignominy and the barbs, the Guptas had shut themselves in their house, keeping their

windows closed, and the curtains tightly drawn. But the neighborhood chatter was loose, and so was the wind that blew.

Shortly afterward, the Guptas were gone from the colony.

The housing streets in the 80s were somewhat like that. Middle-aged women would wait for the men to leave for work to hold colony communion, stitching up rumors and salacious gossip like the cardigans they would knit for their husbands under the lazy winter sun. The men, of course, loved the cardigans.

It was into such a world that Deepak had waded.

Deepak was an attractive dude - a candy feast, some would say. He was friendly; he was tall and athletic; and he had a way with the old and young alike. Often when he passed by, women would pull their saree ends over their heads, not so much to keep the tradition as to keep others from catching their eye rove towards him.

One afternoon, not long after he had moved in, the police turned up at our colony with news about him. They said he had been knifed inside a bus while trying to save a girl from her harassers. His copassengers, including the girl, had walked away, leaving him bleeding on the bus floor. He had lost a lot of blood, and the police weren't sure if he would live or die! The news exploded like a bomb on our colony. Night and day, for weeks, everyone talked only about it. Some people were sensitive and concerned, others scarcely so! Drawing from the Gupta episode, when one family hinted that he might have been having an affair with the girl he tried to save, other families took it up, giving it further grist. When the story

didn't go far, Uncle Prasad stepped in with his twist: Humare hero bachchane chale the ... Ab bhuktein! (The hero was asking for it!)

That line cast the die!

Deepak, of course, survived the attack, but he never returned to the colony. His friends from Punjab took his luggage away, and that was the last anyone heard of him.

On Saturday, many weeks later, my father was describing Bhagat Singh's final moments to us. Apparently, for fear of a

public revolt, the jail authorities had moved the execution 11 hours ahead of schedule. The jail inmates, however, had got wind of it. So, from the morning (of 23rd March), they had lined up behind their barred cells shouting and chanting, Ingilab Zindabad (Long live revolution). At 7.30 pm, amid the rising chorus, Bhagat Singh, and his fellow revolutionaries, Sukhdev, and Rajguru, were taken out of the condemned cells and walked up to the scaffold. There, with the court observer, the doctor, the jailor, and the hangman watching, the three hugged each other, kissed the noose, smiled at death, and swung.

We, who heard it, were dumbstruck. Here was a young and dashing man; affable, intelligent, educated, and born into sufficient affluence. He could have taken comfort in his inheritance, settled down with a beautiful girl, and spent the rest of his life rearing the half-dozen children he would have had with her. Yet, he chose to walk away from it all. How could it be? It surely had to have a deeper meaning.

Before long, we had our answer:

My father said: "When courage and righteousness find their true ground; when the young of India realize that heroes such as Deepak Saini truly belong; Bhagat Singhs will emerge from every house to help India rise and shine in all its deserved glory."

Years later, as a student of English literature, I found a corollary to what he had said in Ralph Waldo Emerson's poem,

Men Wanted. The poem said

Not gold, but only man can make.

A people great and strong.

Men who, for truth and honor's sake,

Stand fast and suffer long.

Brave men who work while others sleep,

Who dare while others fly —

They build a nation's pillars deep. And lift them to the sky.


Throughout history, men have typically
