





FairGaze Covers Peruvian Gastronomy Festival







The fiesta was a celebration of culture and consciousness, leaving everyone with a renewed commitment to safeguard the Ganga for generations to come.





EXCLUSIVE INTERVIEW WITH MS. INDERBIR THUSSU HEAD, KUNSKAPSSKOLAN SCHOOL, GURGAON



ur Community Growth Officer, Ms. Kiran Tomar, recently had the honor of interviewing Ms. Inderbir Thussu, the esteemed Head of Kunskapsskolan School, Gurgaon, and an Honorable Thought Leader at INACE.Org. The conversation provided valuable insights into the philosophy, vision, and core principles of Kunskapsskolan, its distinctive light shedding on educational approach and transformative impact of its innovative learning model.

What is the meaning of the term "Kunskapsskolan"?

The term "Kunskapsskolan" means "The Knowledge School." Kunskapsskolan Schools is a progressive school chain that creates a generation of self-regulated, future-ready, and independent learners.

What is the KED Program?

The KED program stands for the Kunskapsskolan Education Program. It

focuses on personalized learning, making it a unique program. Under this program, students are encouraged to set personal goals, which evolve into a working plan for the week, the semester, and the school year. Teachers, who also act as coaches and subject experts, help students set their goals. They challenge students to find effective learning strategies and, ultimately, assist them in reflecting on their achievements over time.

What is the thematic approach to teaching in Kunskapsskolan?

The thematic approach in Kunskapsskolan involves integrating multiple subjects, such as History, Geography, Art, Music, and Drama, to help students understand that the knowledge they gain in school is connected to real life. For example Theme - The food trails

Students explore -

SST - the civilizations in different eras

influenced by water, crops, houses, etc., crops grown in those areas.

Science - the balanced diet, deficiencies due to the imbalance diet, nutrition in different food and diseases.

Dance/ music/ theatre explores the folk form of the areas.

Art explores folk art and mediums. Students work - they look at a global perspective to explore - specific sites such as - Bhimbetka in MP (Paleolithic site), Birbhanpur in West Bengal (Mesolithic site), Luxmanda in Tanzania, Africa(Neolithic site). The students research the lifestyle of people in the aforementioned through-Food, clothes, health(diseases), and housing(caves) and will present their work in the form of a regional showcase. Students may show the illustration of caves in different eras and depict the culture of the region/ Era through dance, music & theatre through a Dramatic scene.

MASTERING EMOTIONAL REGULATION: RRFΔK FRFF FROM

BREAK FREE FROM AMYGDALA HIJACK

his week, as a coach, I witnessed a recurring struggle among clients—emotional regulation. crippled bv the Many were overwhelming grip of an amygdala hijack, where emotions take over, everyday functioning. impairing Watching people unable to manage their emotions crushes my heart like a cigarette stubbed out against a table.

I see you. I feel you. And yes, I understand you!

We've all regretted those moments of emotional hysteria. Whether it's the sting of anger, the whirl of anxiety, or the sting of over-excitement, unchecked emotions rarely lead to better outcomes. Letting emotions overpower logic is like flying too close to the sun—you're bound to go down in flames.

Emotions are essential—they connect us, guide our instincts, and give life its richness. But when it comes to decision-making or interpreting situations, emotions often cloud our judgment. So, how can we channel them constructively?

Here are five actionable strategies to take charge of your emotional state:

The Ventilation Fallacy

Contrary to popular belief, venting your emotions doesn't necessarily help—it often amplifies them. Instead, do the exact opposite of what you feel. Feeling sad? Watch a horror movie or try something adrenaline-pumping. Anxious? Hit the gym for a mood boost. Angry? Pamper yourself—shop for something you love or book a relaxing salon session. Redirecting your focus to acts of self-love can gradually dilute the negativity.

Name Your Emotions

Words have power, and labeling your emotions helps you reclaim control. Use precise terms like "frustrated," "disappointed," or "suffocated" instead of vague phrases like "tired" or "burned out." Self-awareness starts with clarity, and naming your emotions is the first step to understanding them.



Mix It Up: The 45/15 Rule

Staying absorbed in a single task to avoid negative thoughts doesn't always work. Here's a better approach: work for 45 minutes, then take a 15-minute break. Switch between tasks to maintain a steady dopamine flow. Prolonged focus on the same task diminishes dopamine's effect, and ruminating thoughts can sneak back in. Keep your brain engaged with variety!

Track Your Emotional Patterns

Maintain a journal or use your phone's notes to record your emotional states. Ask yourself:

- · What am I feeling?
- When did it start?
- How is this affecting me?
- What do I want to feel instead? Tracking emotions provides patterns and insights that make them easier to navigate.

Practice the 4-7-8 Breathing Technique

This simple but powerful method instantly calms your emotional storm:

- Inhale for 4 counts
- Hold your breath for 7 counts
- Exhale for 8 counts

This breathing exercise slows your heart rate, lowers blood pressure, and helps your brain regain control.

When All Else Fails...

If emotions still paralyze you, seek professional help or find a coach who can guide you toward the emotional state you desire. There's no shame in reaching out—it's a step toward reclaiming your power.

Remember, emotional regulation isn't about suppressing feelings but learning to manage them effectively. The more you practice, the stronger and more resilient you become. Take charge today—you've got this!
