## ARCHITECTURE OF HARAPPAN CIVILIZATION

he Indian civilization, which is among the earliest and greatest of all Civilizations that existed in the world had its origin around the Indus River. Since it was first explored in 1921, the exploration is continuously been done with new theories emerging. The Indus River Valley Civilization that contribute to the Indian subcontinent along with the modern-day Afghanistan and Pakistan

corridor was the first Civilization in Indian history. Harappa was among the first explored cities found around this Indus River Valley Region, that derive its existence from Old Bronze Age, and it was the core of the Indus Civilization forth it was also known as a "Harappan Civilization". Harappan Civilization included many prominent cities like Kalibangan, Lothal, and Mohenjo Daro which all were extremely popular for their art and culture and especially for their architecture.


The Harappan architecture was constituted of two-division based on the altitude of the town. The relatively higher region of the west was small but full of cultural diversity and comprised religious-spiritual buildings granaries for storing and large assembly halls. This higher architectural area was turned into the "Citadel" which was broadly only for the sophisticated and rich class of the society.

However, the relatively lower land of West was large and designed in rectangular sections of the grid. This "lower town" was a flourished Urban architecture with a well-planned grid, and major roads connecting small streets at right angles. There were one or two-

storied buildings in the "Architecture of Harappan Civilisation" with country yards and made with fired and mortared bricks, and the mud- bricks were sun-dried to provide integral strength to the buildings. The architecture is even comprised of well-constructed Water Supply and Drainage systems connecting residential buildings, halls, and architectural farms. The systems were covered and formed in long straight lines along with the inspection holes at a fixed distance to serve the maintenance purpose.

Hence, this Harappan Architecture was well mentalized baked- bricked walls, and a well-defined drainage system, which formed the foundation of Indian Architecture and redefined its boundaries.

### THE ROCK ART

ock craftsmen utilized various methods and materials. To draw or paint, they made colors from finely ground earth, minerals, or charcoal. Specialists applied shades as solids, how chalk is applied to a chalkboard or Blue color onto a surface through a line. Also, they bound shades with water, pee, creature blood, plant squeezes, or egg yolk and applied the blend to surfaces by utilizing their fingers or brushes produced using creature hair, quills, or split sticks. Etchings were made with fingers on delicate dividers or with rock devices on hard surfaces. The absolute earliest types of rock craftsmanship are cave artistic creations.

The primarily painted cave recognized as being Paleolithic-that is, from the Stone Age-was Altamira in northern Spain. Specialists considered that the work was finished by current people (Homo sapiens) in various stages between around 36,000 and 15,000 years prior.

The workmanship found there highlight canvases and inscriptions, frequently in the blend; for instance, the buffalo figures that prevail were first engraved and afterward painted. These pictures



were executed in a clear bichrome of red and dark, and some additionally have violet tones. Different figures incorporate ponies, deer, human characters, handshaped impressions, and hand stencils. Much of the time, the maker of the pictures took advantage of the normal shapes of the stone surface to add a three-layered quality to the work. France additionally is home to the absolute most popular instances of cavern workmanship, remembering that for Lascaux cave, close to Montignac. The workmanship there was finished during different periods, as far back as 17,000 years prior.



Last, but not the least, we must empower the educators. It is the educator who leaves a mark on the lives of the learners. One must not forget that the future of the world is in our




classrooms today. It is only when the educators take pride in themselves and in their sense of identity as an Indian will they be able to create the ripple effect in the classrooms.

## EVOLUTION OF THE EARTH


